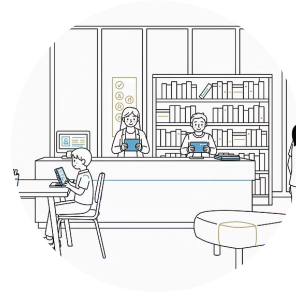

- No shared definition of quality
- Market narratives over evidence
- Public uncertainty about safety
- Policymakers lack comparative data

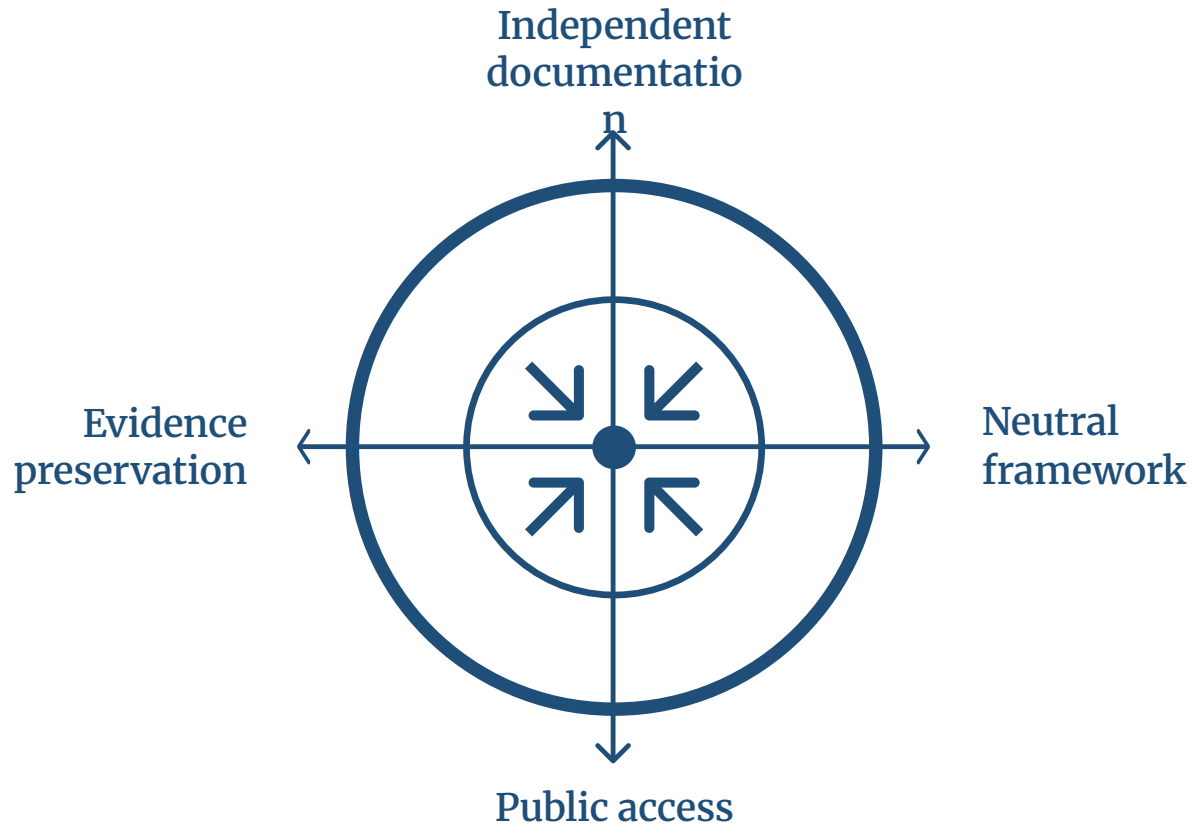

- Sell curriculum
- Certify products
- Endorse vendors
- Rank institutions

What AAB Does

Document real AI education practices and **preserve** structured evidence for **public reference**.

Three Pillars of Documentation

1 **Case Registry**
Document real-world **implementations**: context, constraints, process, outcomes, lessons learned
*Both **successes** and **failures** recorded*

2 **Pilot Registry**
Preserve early-stage **experimentation**: pilot objectives, evaluation design, **risk mitigation**, observed impact
*Focus on **documentation**, not marketing*

3 **Emerging Consensus**
Identify **recurring patterns**: enabling conditions, safety practices, assessment signals
*Extract **patterns**, not certifications*



Why This Matters for Governments

Public Trust Requires Structure

What Governments Need

- Transparent evaluation mechanisms
- Third-party documentation
- Publicly accessible learning records
- Evidence before endorsement

What AAB Provides

- Neutral documentation frameworks
- Open submission architecture
- Structured comparative formats
- Long-term record preservation

 We help **strengthen transparency and public confidence.**

U.S. as Example, Not Limit



In the United States

- AI literacy initiatives emerging rapidly
- Libraries, districts, after-school centers experimenting
- Federal and state agencies discussing guidance
- Parents expressing safety and bias concerns

AAB formed to address this U.S. governance gap

But the structural issue is **global**: Canada, Europe, Australia, Southeast Asia face similar questions.

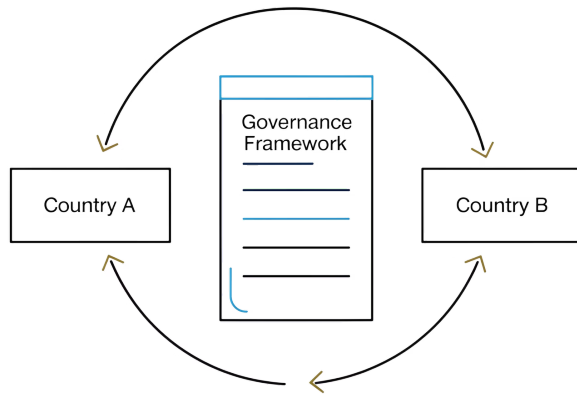
Open Access
